

.1 Making titles

1. GENERAL

The Video-Script 550 is an electronic device to add titles to video films. It is compatible with the video systems VHS, VHS-C, S-VHS, S-VHS-C, Video 8 and Hi8 according to the PAL standard. Titles produced with the Video-Script 550 can be added to the video picture or be displayed against a black or white background.

Up to 10 pages may be prepared and stored at a time. The Video-Script 550 is capable of producing characters in both upper and lower case, in four different sizes and eight colours, with or without contours or simply as outlines. Individual characters may flash. One page may contain 8 lines of 24 characters each. The special effects that can be achieved with the Video-Script 550 are superimpose, running titles, scrolls and wipes.

The Video-Script 550 can also operate in standalone mode, i.e. without a video input signal. The integrated demo programme includes a summary of the various effects that can be produced. The demo is started by pressing the "DEMO" key and terminated by pressing the "MoDE" key. The demo programme and messages issued by the Video-Script 550 are available in both English and German. To switch from one language to the other, press the "ALT" and "LANG" keys at the same time.

We recommend that you read these instructions attentively so as to thoroughly familiarize vourself with the unit.



3. CONNECTING THE EQUIPMENT

Insert the hollow plug of the mains adapter into the socket (1). To prevent any stored titles from being erased from memory when the unit is switched off, you will need to install two 1.5V AAtype batteries in the battery compartment (9). Observe correct polarity of the batteries. Whenever the batteries are replaced, the Video-Script 550 must be switched off.

The video equipment is connected as shown in the following illustration. If an S-video device (carncorder or VCR) is connected to the input connector, two video signals (S-video and standard video) are available at the output connectors.




Switch the Video-Script 550 on by pressing the mains switch (18). If the unit is correctly connected, the red "POWER" LED (17) lights up.

If the screen is not fully utilized or if it does not display all the characters, adjust the width with the "H-width" control (8).

4. OPERATION

4.1 Making titles

When the Video-Script 550 has been switched on, it is in edit mode and you can enter your first title. The display on the screen looks like this:



To select a page for processing, press the "PAGE" key and enter a number between 1 and 0 for the pages 1 - 10. The page number is displayed in the status line. You may now onter text from the keyboard (13) similar to the way you use a typewriter. To enter upper case characters, also press the "SHIFT" key. If you want to use upper case characters only, press the "CAPS LOCK" key (the LED (16) lights up). Pressing this key again returns you to lower case characters. o enter the white keyboard characters press the "ALT" key and keep it down when pressing the character key. To enter the white keyboard characters as upper case characters, press "ALT", SHIFT" and the key for the character in question. Special characters such as 6, 6, 6, etc. are intered with the help of a special function key. To enter 6, for example, first press the \(\frac{1}{2} \) key; he screen does not change. Then press the "e" key; the letter 6 now appears on the screen.

The size of the characters is changed with the "SIZE" key, the colours are changed with the "COLOR" key and the appearance of the characters is changed with the "BORDER" key. The "FLASH" key causes selected characters to flash. The "BACKGROUND" key changes the colour of the background.

Four different colours can be used on one and the same page. These colours are displayed in the colour selection bar in the top right-hand corner of the screen. A total of eight different colours are available. Different colour combinations may be selected for each page. To change the colours, press the "SHIFT" and "COLOR" keys at the same time. This causes the first field of the colour selection bar to flash. Use the "COLOR" key to change the colour. To change another colour in the colour selection bar, move the cursor to the colour that you want to change and change it with the "COLOR" key. Changing a colour in the colour selection bar automatically causes all the characters on that page in that particular colour to be changed.

To select a new page, press the "PAGE" key and one of the 10 numeric keys from 1 - 0.


Note:

To operate, the Video-Script 550 does not necessarily require a video input signal because it features a built-in video signal generator. Please note, however, that in that case only two backgrounds (black and white) are available for the titles.

4.2 Adding special effects

Once you have entered your titles, you want to determine how you wish to add them to your video film.

Press the "MODE" key. The screen displays the following information:



If you have changed from edit mode to programming mode, the page number on the screen is that of the page just edited. If not, you may select page numbers by pressing the "PAGE" key and the numeric key (1 - 0) that identifies the page number.

Now you will want to specify how you wish the page of text to be added to your video film. The word "IN" flashes on the screen. The required effect is selected with the "ROLL" key and the cursor keys (11/12). For a number of effects you can also change the speed with the "SPEED" key.

Press the "IN/OUT" key. Now the word "OUT" flashes. The effect with which you wish the page of text to disappear is programmed in the same manner.

Finally, you will want to determine how long you want a page of text to stay on the screen. Press the "WAIT" key. The word "WAIT" flashes on the screen. Use the "SPEED" key to set the length of time you wish the title to be displayed on the screen.

Fade in/fade out

A simple fade-in or fade-out is produced by pressing the "ENTER" key.

Wipes

The direction from which wipes appear on the screen is selected with the \(\frac{1}{\}\) \(\frac{1}{\}\) keys. The speed of the wipes is changed with the "SPEED" key.

The direction into which wipes disappear from the screen is selected with the \(\frac{1}{4} \) keys. The speed is changed with the "SPEED" key.

Scroll

The first line of a page of text appears at the bottom of the screen and moves towards the top of the screen until the entire page is visible. To achieve this, press the "ROLL" key.

You may use either the fade-out effect or one of the wipe effects to make the text disappear from the screen.

The effect may also be reversed, i.e. the text page is faded in or appears on the screen in the form of a wipe and disappears by rolling towards the top until the last line has disappeared.

Running text

Fo produce running text, press the "IN/OUT" key until the word "IN" flashes; then press the cursor key. The speed at which the text moves across the screen is set with the "SPEED" key. Two font sizes are available for running text. Use the "SIZE" key to select the required font size.

The running text always appears at the bottom of the screen. You may after the position of the running text with the $\uparrow \uparrow$ and $\downarrow \uparrow$ cursor keys.

Background

Finally you determine the background for your text: black, white or the video picture.

The following table summarizes the special effects.

4.3 Displaying titles

To enter display mode, press the "MODE" key once more. The text pages may be displayed in either one of two ways:

- each page is displayed "manually"
- all pages are automatically displayed, one after the other

To display a page "manually", first press the "PAGE" key and enter the number of the page in question; then press the "ENTER" key. To cause the page to disappear, press the space bar.

The "AUTO" key enables you to change from manual to automatic display mode. In automatic mode the LED (14) is on.

To display all pages automatically, press the "PAGE" key and enter the number of the first page to be displayed. Then press the "ENTER" key, all pages will now be displayed one after the other.

5. SUMMARY OF FUNCTIONS

Key Function

SHIFT As long as the SHIFT key is kept down, all characters appear in upper case.

CAPS LOCK Only upper case characters are produced: the LED "CAPS LOCK" (16) is

on.

ALT To enter the white keyboard characters.

Key for special characters

ALT + LANG Switch from German to English demo programme and messages.

DELETE Delete the character marked by the cursor.

PAGE + DELETE Pressing the PAGE key and the DELETE key causes the entire page to be

deleted

ENTER Skip to a new line.

Cursor To position the cursor.

SIZE Pressing this key changes the font size.

COLOR Pressing this key changes the colour.

SHIFT + COLOR The cursor moves to the colour selection bar. Use the cursor to indicate a

colour and change it by pressing the COLOR key.

BORDER Pressing this key causes the characters to appear with contours, without

contours or as outlines only.

BACKGROUND Pressing this key causes the background to change to either black, white or

FLASH Pressing this key causes the character to flash.

PAGE + <number> Display a particular page.

MODE Press this key to switch between edit mode, programming mode and

display mode.

IN/OUT Select whether a special effect applies to the way a title is to appear or

disappear.

SPECIAL EFFECTS

ENTER Fade in/fade out

ROLL

Running text

WAIT Select the "Wait" function.

Scroll

SPEED Select the speed at which a title is to appear or disappear and define the

length of time during which it remains on the screen.

AUTO Switch from automatic page display to "manual" page display.
